

UWA Aquatic Centre Conditions of Entry

Management reserves the right to refuse your admission to the Aquatic Centre, and/or cancel your program registration, for any breach of these Conditions of Entry.

Access

- Only those with a valid membership, paid entry or registered in a program may enter the Aquatic Centre.
- A valid UWA Sport access card must be presented and scanned at the Aquatics Office before access is permitted.
- Those who a registered in a UWA Sport Aquatic Program E.g. Learn to Swim are not required to pay entry, purchase an access card or scan in at entry.
- Access to the Aquatic Centre is only available during opening hours, as set by UWA Sport. The Centre is accessible to students, staff, and the public (16 years and older) during allocated times only. Times are displayed on the UWA Sport website sport.uwa.edu.au. Prior to closing time, UWA Sport staff will provide a courtesy reminder and users will be asked to vacate the building at closing time. Users are not permitted to use the Aquatic Centre, including equipment or changerooms, after closing time.
- Children under the age of 10 years are not permitted to enter the Aquatic Centre without a parent/guardian (over the age of 16 years).
- Children under the age of 16 with a medical condition must be accompanied by a parent/guardian within the Aquatic Centre. No emergency medication is kept within the Centre.

Use of Equipment and Facilities

- Appropriate swimming attire must always be worn in the Aquatic Centre (incl. babies). Swimming caps are required.
- Return all equipment after use. Please do not move or use large fixtures or equipment e.g. swim platforms, stairs, or tables. Use of equipment is approved by Aquatic staff only.
- You must always follow the instruction of a trained coach, swimming instructor, lifeguard or other UWA Sport employee. Diving blocks can only be used under the supervision of a trained coach or swimming instructor.

Conduct and Behaviour

- Abusive or offensive language or behaviour is not permitted, including swearing and spitting. People suspected to be under the influence of drugs or alcohol will be asked to leave. Any behaviour considered improper or disorderly or that may interfere with the health, safety, comfort or enjoyment of others will be acted on, and you may be asked to leave.
- The University of Western Australia is a smoke free campus.
- Animals (except guide dogs), glass, drugs or alcohol, are not permitted on the grounds or in the Aquatic Centre.
- Bikes, scooters, and skateboards are not permitted in the Aquatic Centre. Bike racks are provided outside.
- Do not climb up, or onto any fence or partition of roof within the Aquatic Centre.
- No illegal or unauthorised private business may be conducted within UWA Sport facilities and/ or its surrounding grounds.
- UWA Sport reserves the right to refuse you admission to a UWA Sport venue including the Aquatic Centre due to inappropriate or harmful behaviour or conduct, a concern for health or safety, or your failure to comply with these terms and conditions, including but not limited to sharing your visit passes. Where access is refused by us, you are not entitled to a refund of the cost of the visit passes.

Health and Safety

- Only exercise if you are medically and physically fit to do so. It is the responsibility of patrons to advise staff of any serious pre-existing injuries or medical conditions before exercising.
- Let staff know if you see any faulty equipment, potential hazards, incidents, or accidents in the Aquatic Centre.
- All users must familiarise themselves with emergency procedures displayed throughout the Aquatic Centre, and alert staff immediately should an emergency arise.
- Do not enter the pool/s if you are suffering from any skin problems, illness or disease that is contagious (medical certificates required to show no risk to patrons).
- Do not enter the water if you have diarrhoea or have had gastroenteritis within the last 14 days.
- Do not use soap or detergent whilst in or surrounding the pools.
- Do not bring glass (including, glass water bottles) into the Centre.

Release

• A lifeguard is not always required to be on duty at this Centre. Users enter the Aquatic Centre at their own risk and accept that UWA Sport management, its employees, contractors, agents and the University of Western Australia will not be liable for any injuries sustained at the Aquatic Centre or any lost property, and consent to receiving any medical treatment staff consider necessary.
