


What do Australians think about a future vaccination mandate?



In the event of a future pandemic, **65% of Australians say that they would be willing to accept a mandatory vaccination policy.**

21% would not accept a mandatory vaccination policy.

14% are unsure.


Older adults aged 65 years+ are more likely to accept the policy (76%), while only 59% of 35-49-year-olds would accept the policy.

In WA specifically, willingness to accept the policy is even lower for 35-49-year-olds (51%).

Overall, **one-third (33%) of Australians** think that a mandatory vaccination policy would **not be necessary** in a future pandemic.

In addition to medical exemptions, **44% of Australians think that there should also be exemptions available for ANY genuine personal beliefs.**

Australians (25%) would try to avoid being vaccinated

under a vaccination mandate policy. For 35-49-year-olds, 31% would try to avoid vaccination.

If a vaccination mandate was implemented for a future pandemic, Australians would feel...

For older Australians aged 65 years+, three-quarters (75%) would feel protected and safe and almost two-thirds (66%) relieved. Only 25% would feel worried.

...protected **66%**
 ...safer **65%**
 ...relieved **52%**
 ...worried **35%**




If a mandatory vaccination policy was implemented for a future pandemic, **53% of Australians say they would speak positively about it to family member or friends (44% WA); 27% would not (30% WA).**

Penalties for non-compliance should be strictly enforced



Almost half (47%) of Australians believe that the Government should not have the power to require people to be vaccinated.



50% of Australians believe that the Government cannot **ETHICALLY** require people to be vaccinated.
