## NOTES RELATING TO ELECTION OF WARDEN, DEPUTY WARDEN AND ORDINARY COUNCILORS

# QUALIFICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP OF CONVOCATION (SECTION 17(1) OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA ACT 1911):

Select one of the following criteria:

- (a) members and past members of the Senate;
- (b) graduates of the University;
- (c) persons not referred to in paragraph (a) or (b) who were members of Convocation immediately before the coming into operation of the *Universities Legislation Amendment Act 2016* section 152;
- (d) persons who the Senate may, from time to time, admit to be members of Convocation.

Any Member is eligible to be elected as the Warden, the Deputy Warden or an Ordinary Councilor unless —

- (a) the Member is a bankrupt or a person whose affairs are under insolvency laws for the purposes of the Interpretation Act 1984 Section 13D; or
- (b) the Member is disqualified from managing corporations under the Corporations Act2001 (Commonwealth) Part 2D.6; or
- (c) the Member has been convicted of an offence and sentenced to a term of imprisonment and has not completed the term of imprisonment or been pardoned; or
- (d) an administration order is in force under the Guardianship and Administration Act 1990 Part 6 in respect of the Member.

#### **POSITIONS NOMINATED FOR:**

Candidates may nominate for each or all positions.

#### **CANDIDATE BIOGRAPHIES:**

Candidates may supply a biography with a statement to support their candidacy stating why they are standing for the office, what they will bring to the office and what they hope to achieve. It should be submitted headed by the candidate's Surname and First name (not part of 250 word biography) only (as stated by the candidate on the nomination form). Honorifics etc. can be included in the text the candidate submits.

- 1. A person seeking election may deliver, with the nomination, a biography not exceeding 250 words in length, containing all or any of the following particulars of that person:
  - (a) degree or degrees, date of graduation and other professional qualifications;
  - (b) profession or position;
  - (c) details of work on bodies connected or associated with the University;
  - (d) prizes won, publications issued and research done;
  - (e) particular goals and skills a candidate would bring to Convocation
  - (e) service whether in war or peace to the community or any section of it and positions held in connection with that service:
  - (f) such other particulars as the candidate may consider appropriate.
- 2. If an election is required, the biography of each candidate for election will be submitted to the Vice-Chancellor who in consultation with the Warden, except when the Warden is seeking election, may delete any matter which is considered to be offensive, defamatory or untrue.
- 3. If possible, before exercising the power to delete any matter from a biography the Vice-Chancellor or Warden must consult the candidate concerned.
- 4. A copy of the approved biography of each Member seeking election showing his or her name and address and the names of the proposer and seconder must accompany the ballots

#### **PLEASE NOTE THAT:**

A recent photograph (head and shoulders) may be supplied with the biography.

The candidate may include in the biography an email address and/or contact phone number to enable voters to contact them to discuss their candidacy.

Copies of all approved biographies will be forwarded to voters with the voting papers if an election is required. Biographical material will be presented below the candidate's Surname and First name and, consistent with Clause 44 and 45, particulars (if available) of year of admission to Convocation, qualification for membership, whether the candidate is a current office holder seeking re-election and the names of the Proposer and Seconder (not part of 250 word biography and statement).
