Lawrence Wilson Art Gallery is one of Western Australia's premier public art institutions, located next to the Sunken Gardens on the University of Western Australia's scenic Crawley campus.

The gallery offers an innovative and accessible program of exhibitions, talks, workshops and other opportunities to engage with the best of arts and culture from Western Australia and beyond.

Our program regularly connects to the expertise of University staff and students, sharing their research with the wider community. It also offers a range of opportunities for University staff and students to connect with the gallery, both inside and outside of the classroom.

Jintulu: People of the Sun

Jintulu: People of the Sun follows the long shadow cast by colonisation and the bleak legacy of genocide, dispossession and racism that remains etched into contemporary Australia

The End of History

The End of History examines a tumultuous decade, between 1985 and 1995, through the lens of the University of Western Australia Art Collection

Origins

An exploration of beginnings and endings – of family mythologies, births, deaths and cosmic cycles. The minutiae of the everyday expanding outwards to the source of life

September -December



Stuffed Bolstered and Upholstered

An exploration of fibre and woven forms in relation to the human body. Contemporary makers innovate using the traditions of old as they create pieces that critique power dynamics.

Sculpt provides UWA students with a year-long engagement opportunity, immersing them in the workings of an art gallery.

Throughout the program, participants curate a series of events and projects in partnership with the LWAG team. They contribute insights to enhance the gallery's connection with UWA students and collaborate closely with the gallery team to foster an inclusive, accessible and meaningful environment for students. Through this experience, students acquire valuable skills applicable across diverse professional settings.

Purpose

Commitment

- Curate a diverse array of student events, programs, and initiatives through an inclusive expression of interest (EOI) process, fostering a vibrant and engaging environment for UWA students within the gallery.
- Acquire practical knowledge and experience regarding the operational functions of art galleries, including an understanding of organisational roles and cultural significance.
- o Develop skills in audience engagement strategies and the design and implementation of public programming.
- o Gain insights into the structures and functions of committees, fostering a deeper understanding of organisational dynamics and governance principles.


Collection Research Project
