Bios

Alan Lourens - Conductor

Professor Alan Lourens is Head of the UWA Conservatorium of Music, where he directs the Orchestra, as well as teaching conducting, pedagogy and courses in music education. He has appeared as a guest conductor for orchestras and bands throughout Asia, Australia and the US, as well as performances internationally on Euphonium.

Alan holds a Doctorate in Conducting and Masters degree in Euphonium Performance from Indiana University. Publications include contributions to the Teaching Music Through Performance in Band series of books and the MBM Times. Cimarron Publishing has released his compositions and arrangements for both band and orchestra.





Claire Nankivell - Conductor

Claire Nankivell is a conductor, music educator, and flautist based in Western Australia. She holds a Bachelor of Music, Graduate Diploma of Education, and a Master of Education (Music) from the University of Western Australia.

As a scholar in Perth Symphony Orchestra's Women on the Podium program, Claire receives conducting mentorship from Jessica Gethin and Alice Farnham.

She conducts multiple school ensembles, from beginner groups to high performance bands, and is known for her clear, effective leadership and commitment to developing young musicians. She is also a specialist flute teacher at the

Instrumental Music School Services, working across multiple schools to help bring the joy of music education.

As a performer, Claire has played with various ensembles including the West Australian Youth Wind Ensemble, as well as performing as a soloist where she has premiered new works.

Claire serves on the committee for the Australian Band and Orchestra Directors' Association Western Australia (ABODA WA), working to support school ensembles and provide professional development for conductors across the state.

Paul Tanner - Timpani

Paul Tanner is the Chair of Percussion at the University of Western Australia and Principal Percussionist of the Perth Symphony Orchestra. He has performed throughout Australia and South-East Asia for Musica Viva; in the UK with Grammy-nominated guitarist, Craig Ogden; with diverse groups at the Adelaide, Sydney, and Perth International Arts Festivals; at Darwin's Bougainvillea and International Guitar Festivals; and in the east coast of Australia with New York's Bang-on-a-Can Allstars.

Paul studied with Steven Schick in San Diego, and gained insight into the percussion music of other cultures by



travelling and studying in Latin America and West Africa. He has collaborated with musicians from diverse genres, composers, dancers, circus performers, dramaturgs, poets and painters; built and composed for invented instruments; educated future performers through schools' performances and residencies; composed works for students and professional soloists; and arranged works by composers as diverse as J.S. Bach, Ed Sheeran and lannis Xenakis. His recent PhD project, researching and developing repertoire for one player performing marimba and vibraphone simultaneously, was awarded the medals for 'most outstanding research thesis' by both WAAPA and Edith Cowan University.
