Vertebrates are animals with a backbone, like this bilby.

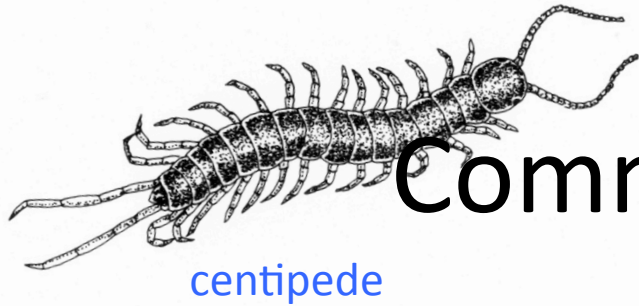


Invertebrates are animals without a backbone, like this caterpillar.

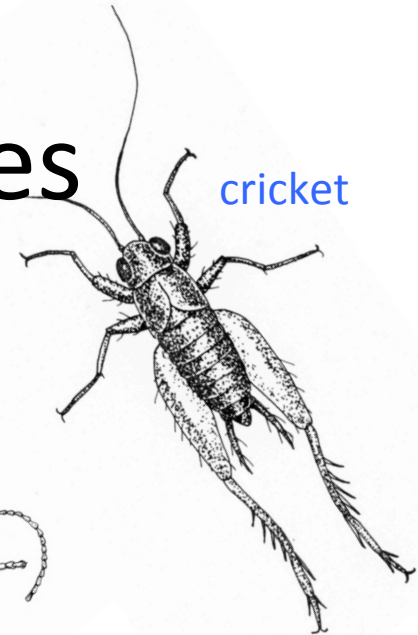

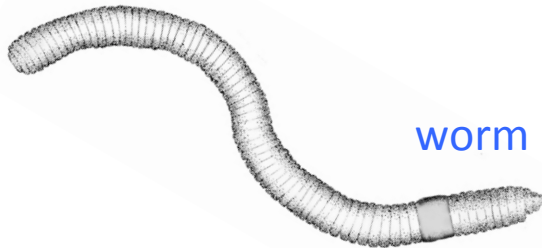

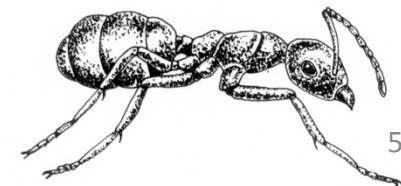
