Scams and fraudulent activities are considered 'financial disinformation' as they are intended to deliberately mislead you by shaping behaviour in order to gain a financial benefit.

Scamwatch, run by the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission, (ACCC), is an Australian Government initiative that helps consumers and small businesses to recognise, avoid and report scams.


