Title and brief description	OPTMM511 Anterior and dry eye disease – PART 2. The core components of this micro-credential are pathophysiology, diagnosis and management of dry eye disease. Participants will enhance their understanding of anterior eye conditions and implement the latest evidence-based knowledge. In acknowledging the multifactorial nature of dry eye disease, this short course enables practitioners to provide effective patient centred care in chronic disease management.
