### *Critical Information Summary*

Title and brief description	OPTMM515 Comprehensive glaucoma care – PART 2. The course will cover a comprehensive range of topics, including: Foundational concepts in glaucoma, providing essential background knowledge on glaucoma risk factors, relevant anatomy, pathophysiology, types and appropriate intervention methods. The lectures will focus on the types of glaucoma such as Normal Tension Glaucoma (NTG), Primary Open Angle Glaucoma (POAG), Primary Angle Closure Glaucoma (PACG), with a focus on clinical presentation, acute and chronic forms, diagnostic strategies, and principles of treatment. This includes the surgical indications in glaucoma, examining when surgical intervention is appropriate and the types of procedures commonly used. Glaucoma is a chronic disorder that needs long term collaborative care, therefore, the principles of effective co-management of glaucoma patients will be explored.
