Title and brief description	SWSPM103 Working with Men in Domestic Family Violence - A Culturally Responsive Approach. This micro-credential equips professionals with knowledge and skills to work with men who use violence, using trauma-informed, culturally safe approaches across all communities, including First Nations.
Certified learning	(1) describe the frameworks, theories and drivers of DFV that include a First Nations Lens; (2) identify the various forms of DFV and pattern-based abuse; (3) utilise the perpetrator mapping tool to enhance perpetrator accountability, and recognise grooming and collusion when working with men; (4) develop skills and language to document patterned abuse underpinned by principles of the Safe and Together Model; (5) apply skills and interventions to engage safely with men, including men in First Nations communities; and (6) articulate how traditional knowledge systems and cultural frameworks can support behaviour change.
