Title and brief description	IMEDM500 Clinical Teaching in Medicine. This microcredential provides educational support and formal recognition for junior doctors delivering education to medical students in the clinical environment.
Certified learning	(1) describe structures and approaches to clinical teaching applicable to medical students in the clinical setting; (2) demonstrate how to design clinical learning activities and adapt these for medical students across stages of learning and in a variety of clinical contexts; (3) facilitate clinical education sessions for medical students, at the individual, small group, and large group level; (4) provide constructive feedback to learners following clinical teaching sessions; and (5) develop reflection skills to enhance competence and professionalism as a medical educator.
